An advanced knowledge of biblical theology. An insight into the main theological themes of the individual books of the Bible. Old Testament: the interpretation of the major prophetic books (Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Amos, Hosea, Jonah) and the phenomenon of "prophecy" as well as the prophetic figures in the historical books of the Old Testament. New Testament: the interpretation of selected Pauline writings and an insight into the theology of the Johannine writings.

Intended learning outcomes

At the end of the course, students will have gained an in-depth insight into the theology of the books of the Bible. They will have developed advanced knowledge and skills in the are of biblical theology. Students will be able to group the books of the Bible by themes and to interpret them on the basis of specific criteria. They will be able to investigate topics and use methods in both Old and New Testament studies.
