Contents

This module provides students seeking specialisation in biblical theology with deeper insights into advanced topics and current problems in biblical theology than regular courses. It gives them the opportunity to review texts, including biblical texts and apocrypha, and to use exegetical research methods. The module gives students an advanced understanding of the historical context, composition, and intention of biblical texts and apocrypha. It provides insights into current research in the field and how research topics and findings can be translated into lessons for the religious education classroom.

Intended learning outcomes

At the end of the course, students will have gained an in-depth insight into the books of the Bible. Students will be able to group the books of the Bible by themes and to interpret them on the basis of specific criteria. Students will have become familiar with advanced topics and current problems in biblical theology and exegetical research. They will be able to review biblical texts and apocrypha as well as to translate research topics and findings into lessons for the religious education classroom and simplify them for teaching purposes. Students will have developed advanced knowledge and skills in the are of biblical theology.

- a) oral examination of one candidate each (approx. 15 minutes) or b) oral examination in groups (groups of 2: approx. 30 minutes, groups of 3: approx. 45 minutes) or c) talk (approx. 15 minutes) or d) written examination (approx. 30 minutes) or e) assessments during lecture period (approx. 3 to 5 assessments, 30 hours total) or f) term paper (approx. 10 pages)
