Seminar in Old Testament discussing selected topics in Old Testament to equip students with advanced knowledge in the area of biblical theology. Discussion of key topics in fundamental theology with special attention to the question about God.		
<b>Intended learning outcomes</b>		
At the end of the course, students will have developed advanced knowledge and skills in the area of Old Testament exegesis and theology. They will be able to investigate topics and use methods in Old Testament studies, to independently analyse exegetical literature, and to apply it to the texts and topics discussed, using appropriate methods. Students will have been introduced to the God-talk of fundamental theology and will have developed the ability to independently apply what they have learned to contemporary issues. In addition, they will have become familiar with traditional arguments for the existence of God as well as with the Catholic theology of religions and will be able to independently situate themselves within the current debate.
