Contents

Deeper insights into selected aspects of early, medieval, and modern church history, including but not limited to early church christology (from the Council of Nicaea to the Council of Chalcedon), early Christian lifestyle (baptism, eucharist, penance) as well as ways of Christian thought and fundamental issues of historical ecclesiology in the Middle Ages and the modern age. The mandatory elective seminar explores a key topic in early, medieval, or modern church history or Franconian church history or eastern church history.

Intended learning outcomes

At the end of the course, students will have become familiar with selected aspects of early, medieval, and modern church history. They will be able to critically reflect upon topical issues and take their own well-founded position on them.
