The mandatory elective seminar explores a key topic in early, medieval, or modern church history or Franconian church history or eastern church history.</p>

<p>At the end of the course, students will have become familiar with selected aspects of early, medieval, and modern church history. They will be able to critically reflect upon topical issues and take their own well-founded position on them.</p>
