#### **Contents**

Fundamental developments in early, medieval, and modern church history and major events that shaped the history of the Church. Discussion of major stages in Franconian church history using the example of the Diocese of Würzburg. Methods in historical theology: exercise to give students the opportunity to practise working with written historical sources and gain an insight into historical auxiliary sciences.

### **Intended learning outcomes**

At the end of the course, students will have become familiar with fundamental developments in church history and major events that shaped the history of the Church. They will have developed an understanding of developments in church history and will be able to situate them within a context and form a critical opinion about them. Students will have learned methods in historical theology and will have gained an insight into historical auxiliary sciences.
