<b>Contents</b>		
Detailed study of New Testament texts and their contexts. Discussion of advanced topics in Bible and literary genres. Discussion and exegetical interpretation of books of the New Testament including gospels, letters, the Book of Acts, and the apocalypse. The module thus covers a range of topics in New Testament theology. In addition, it discusses topics in literary studies, the history of religion as well as theology.		
<b>Intended learning outcomes</b>		
At the end of the course, students will have become familiar with key biblical texts and topics in Bible. They will have developed an awareness of the historical development and religious historical context of biblical texts. In addition, students will be able to use exegetical methods to interpret those texts. They will have developed the ability to critically reflect upon topical issues relating to the Bible and take their own well-founded position on them.
