Detailed discussion of topics and methods in fundamental theology and philosophy. A particular focus will be on topics in theological epistemology and religious philosophy (including atheist criticism of religion) as well as our understanding of revelation as described in the encyclical letter Fides et Ratio.		
<b>Intended learning outcomes</b>		
At the end of the course, students will have become familiar with key topics in fundamental theology as well as with some of the philosophical positions on God-talk. They will also be familiar with the outlines of the history of the dialogue between philosophy and theology and will be able to make informed contributions to topical debates.
