Module components 01-ST-GFDG1-1 and 01-ST-GFDG2-1 acquaint students with essential methods in the discipline and discuss relevant issues relating to christology, the doctrine of God, theological anthropology, and the doctrine of the sacraments. In 01-ST-GFDG1-1, the lecture will be accompanied by an exercise.		
<b>Intended learning outcomes</b>		
At the end of the course, students will have become familiar with the methods typically used in the discipline. They will also be familiar with the biblical foundations for a systematic reflection upon the issues identified above as well as with the decisions of the tradition of the magisterium of the Church that are relevant to them. In addition, students will have developed the ability to determine the relevance of faith to contemporary issues and to theologially justify it.
