Students are familiar with teaching subjects of the courses, this means they are acquainted with the basic facts of the ancient Egyptian cultural history and have skills concerning the methodological dealing with archaeological and philological issues as well as basic knowledge of the ancient Near East history and the archaeology and topography of an important ancient Near East city. Students are familiar with the respective technical literature and the general tendencies of research concerning the individual areas.
