<p>Building on the earlier class on contemporary Chinese politics, this module provides a detailed analysis of political trends in Chinese domestic politics. Starting at an advanced level the course will focus on either of the following aspects of Chinese domestic politics: Grassroots Politics (rural and urban governance reforms, protests and contentious politics, NGOs and social activism); Elite Politics (factions and personalities, politics of succession, decision-making structures and processes, elite formation in the wider polity); Political Culture (mass political culture and dominant intellectual trends, political values and attitudes, variants of Chinese nationalism).</p>

<p>Students receive a systematic introduction to research on Chinese politics, learn about relevant theoretical and methodological approaches and the necessary sources. They are acquainted with the current scholarly debates in the field and cutting-edge research. This will prepare them for the writing of their Master's theses.</p>
