<p>Building on basic knowledge on Transformation in Urban and Rural China this module will take an in-depth look at urban-rural issues that have arisen due to the process of rapid modernization and urbanization since the late 1970s. The class will focus on different aspects, e.g. rural issues (Three Rural Issues, Building a New Socialist Countryside), rural-to-urban transition (shifting identities, in situ urbanization, rural urbanization), or questions of land and property (pro-growth coalitions, urbanization of the soil, urban transitional spaces, land use rights).</p>

<p>Students gain in-depth knowledge of different aspects related to on-going process of urbanization and modernization in contemporary China. They will familiarize themselves with specific issues and related methodological approaches as well as the current state of academic research, thereby training their analytical capacities and preparing them to conduct their own research in this field.</p>
