<p>Two out of four exercises must be taken and both have to be from the same field (linguistics or older German literature). The preparation course older German literature comprises: The Recapitulation and consolidation of the literary and literary historical knowledge that is relevant for the state examination. Critical examination of current research approaches and their use on texts that are relevant for the state examination. The preparation course German linguistics includes: The Recapitulation and consolidation of linguistic knowledge. The module will cover the critical examination of current research approaches. In respect of the state examination, in which the analysis competence of different sub-areas of linguistics will be required, the knowledge will be applied on specific text analyses that will be chosen from the area of modern German and early linguistic periods (sign and form system, syntax, semantics, pragmatics, textual linguistics).</p>		
<b>Intended learning outcomes</b>		
<p>Concerning the sub-module and examination course older German literature: Students possess consolidated knowledge of German literature of the pre-modern period; They are able to classify the knowledge into systematic correlations and to apply this knowledge to the independent text analysis. Concerning the sub-module and examination course German linguistics: Students possess consolidated knowledge of German linguistics (sign and form system, syntax, semantics, pragmatics, text linguistics) and concerning the history of the German language; They are able to constitute the knowledge systematically and to apply it to the analysis of modern German and historical texts of former linguistic periods independently.</p>
