Students acquire detailed knowledge of the area folkloric religiousness, religiosity and spirituality research; Consolidation and expansion of cultural-scientific methodical expertise; Introduction to and critical dealing with historical as well as current research issues of the folkloric religiousness, religiosity and spirituality research.		
<b>Intended learning outcomes</b>		
Students achieve skills in order to understand and classify, in a historical and sociocultural context, the religiousness-historical, religious and spiritual phenomena of the Middle Ages and the Early Modern Era. Furthermore, they acquire skills concerning the influence of important historical cultural contacts on the cultural diversity in Europe in the respective period of time. Due to their independent analysis, students are able to classify the mentioned phenomena into a larger cultural or social and historical context. Additionally, they are able to deal independently with basic as well as with current issues of folkloric religiousness, religiosity and spirituality research as well as with basic questions of folkloric alterity research, which they reflect and combine with their own research results.
