Students achieve current folkloric methods and analysis concepts concerning the sociocultural classification of historical as well as material culture. They are able to classify materialisations of culture according to their relevance for the everyday life in the Middle Ages and Early Modern Era. They also acquire the ability to deal independently with basic as well as current issues of the folkloric dealing with the material culture and to present these issues independently.
