The central theoretical and practical features of ethnomusicological regional research are taught, taking into account the methods of affine Cultural Studies and Humanities disciplines. Music is covered not only as an aesthetic phenomenon, but also in its respective anthropological, socio-cultural and religious context. Students will also be provided with the basics of the study of performance and historical performance practice in traditional cultures.

Intended learning outcomes

The student is qualified to theoretically understand the basics of musical regional research and, if necessary, general discourses of historical performance practice on the basis of a specific regional culture. One objective here can also be the acquisition of practical music competences.
