<p>Students acquire detailed knowledge of a linguistic focus (content-related and/or methodological nature) and are able to summarise and critically look at current research of linguistics; they broaden their knowledge concerning the identification and analysis of English linguistic phenomena into selected linguistic data and become aware of the relevance of linguistics and its importance for society; as a first step, they are instructed to conduct research on their own.</p>
