<p>Topics, methods and concepts in English literary and cultural studies:  This module focuses on the topics, methods and concepts that have been central or particularly productive in English literary and cultural studies during recent decades. The most important terminologies and approaches will be explained and discussed with a specific view to ongoing fundamental transformations of the discipline. Consequently, the reading list for this course will put a particular emphasis on methodological and theoretical texts. However, the approaches and concepts put forward in these texts will be substantiated by reference to significant literary texts and cultural examples.</p>

<p>By successfully participating in the module students acquire specialised knowledge concerning the most significant current research questions, methodologies and concepts in literary and cultural studies. They also learn how to put these question, methodologies and concepts to work in autonomously dealing with texts and phenomena from the UK and the Anglophone world.</p>
