By means of selected examples, it conveys and deepens the most important fundamental as well as current theories, terminologies, and methods in English linguistics.

After attending the module, students will be able to explain and discuss the most important fundamental theories and methods of English linguistics, to apply the subject-specific theories and methods in a scientific context and to refer to them in order to analyse linguistic issues. Students will also be able to read and understand mainly complex theoretical linguistic texts, to describe, reflect critically, and abstract multi-layered issues, models, methods, terminologies and theories of linguistics.
