Students are acquainted with different topics and methods of research in the field of the Middle Ages and Early Modern Age; They will acquire the ability to deal independently with basic and current issues of research of the Middle Ages and the Early Modern Age and to present these issues independently (research works, presentations and other methods, seminar papers and other textualisation and presentation types). They are familiar with methods of the self-organisation and time management and are able to analyze current research topics and compile individual articles for research under tutelage.
