A final oral examination will not take place. In the case of a Master with two main disciplines, an issue that covers a problem, which affects both main disciplines interdisciplinarily, can be given. The topic is to be agreed upon with an authorised examiner or, in the case of an interdisciplinary thesis, 2 authorised examiners. Students receive 30 ECTS credit points for their Master's thesis.</p>
