They will do interpretation exercises concerning Latin texts; elevated standard.

Students get an overview of Latin literature in its genres; They are able to interpret important works of Latin authors; In terms of Roman literary history, students acquire knowledge of important sections; They are familiar with its cultural-historical backgrounds. With regard to the state examinations, students are expected to be able to interpret challenging text passages of Latin literature in-depth and methodologically.
