Students will deal in-depth with a more demanding representative of Latin literature. In the course of this: they will get a theoretical introduction to interpretation methods and a practical training in text analysis; they will be instructed in the correct handling of academic secondary literature; analysis of literary-historical contexts and discussion of questions of genre; they will deal with the history of tradition and reception. Students will be introduced to an essential sub-area of Latin Philology. Within this framework: they will be introduced to interpretation methods, elements of text analysis and literary-historical contexts; they will get an overview of intellectual-historical and cultural backgrounds and gain insights into the history of transmission and historical influence.		
Intended learning outcomes		
Students get an overview of Latin literature in its genres; they are able to interpret important Latin authors and works; they have knowledge of important sections of Roman literary history; they are familiar with their cultural-historical backgrounds. Students have an in-depth ability to develop a limited sub-area of Latin literature with the methodological tools of classics and have solid experience with various methods of interpretation and their application.
