They will do interpretation exercises on Latin texts at an advanced level.

Students get an overview of Latin literature in its genres; they are able to interpret important Latin authors and works; they have knowledge of important sections of Roman literary history; they are familiar with their cultural-historical backgrounds. They are able to interpret even difficult text passages from the field of Latin literature in a confident, profound and methodical manner.
