<b>Contents</b>		
<p>Students will be introduced to an essential sub-area of Latin Philology. In this context, they will be introduced to interpretation methods, elements of text analysis and literary historical coherences; They will get an overview of intellectual and cultural backgrounds; The students will be introduced to tradition history and history of literary reception. They will translate important, not too challenging texts from the area of Latin prose into German; Thus, repetition of significant units of school grammar, discussion of metric phenomena, instruction to historical linguistic and stylised text analysis, introduction to different interpretations methods will be covered. Students will deal in-depth with important, not too challenging Latin literature. Thus, they will be theoretically introduced to interpretation methods and practical training of text analysis; They will be instructed on dealing with academic secondary literature appropriately; They will analyse literary historical coherences as well as discuss genre issues; They will deal with the history of tradition and reception.</p>		
<b>Intended learning outcomes</b>		
<p>Students have an overview of Latin literature in their genres; They are able to interpret important works of Latin authors; They have knowledge of important sections of Roman literary history; They are familiar with cultural-historical backgrounds. Students are expected to consolidate and broaden their skills of school grammar, which they have acquired in the basic module; They have solid knowledge in the field of language history and historical grammar; They are familiar with fundamental methods of text analysis and interpretation of texts. They are able to acquire knowledge of a limited sub-area of Latin literature with the methodological tools of classics; They obtain experience with diverse interpretation methods and their application.</p>
