Students learn about intellectual positions, arguments, terminology and reference systems of the respective schools of thought and epochs based on original texts in translation. An introduction into exemplary fields of Chinese intellectual history is provided. As terminology is also dealt with in Chinese language, basic knowledge of Chinese is highly recommended.</p>
