The module deals with the direct and indirect material and media transmission of music: written, notational, electronic and sound storage, instrument systematics and Organology, iconography of music and musical instruments, and the media representation of music. Problems are addressed in relation to the concept of source, the difference between the concepts of writing and text at the intersection of performance (writing as action, text as "frozen action"), and finally the content and scope of the concept or metaphor "instrument".

The student is able to assess the dependence of music on its material and mnemonic tradition and to interpret indirect evidence of music, its performance and reception, to classify instruments and to classify them historically, as well as to read music as a significant symbol of traditional cultures.
