<p>In this module, the basic compositional principles of European music from the early modern period to the present, as well as its contemporary music theoretical contexts, are studied. The two courses, which will be coordinated in terms of content, focus on models of composition based on the traditional theories of counterpoint, basso continuo and different harmonic concepts. Using significant examples, techniques of historically informed analysis of music will be practised and their possibilities and limitations will be discussed.</p>
