To pass the module as a whole students must pass the first assessment component and one of the remaining three. <p>Assessment in module component o6-MA-GW-1-102: Globalisierung und Weltgesellschaft (Globalisation and World Society), in module component o6-MA-GW-2-102: Mechanismen sozialen Wandels (Mechanisms of Social Change), in module component o6-MA-GW-3-102: Globalisierung in den Internationalen Beziehungen (Globalisation in International Relations), and in module component o6-MA-GW-4-102: Normative Politische Theorie (Normative Political Theory) :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 5 ECTS credits, numerical grading a) presentation (maximum 30 minutes) and term paper (approx. 20 pages) or b) presentation (maximum 30 minutes) and written examination (approx. 90 minutes) or c) presentation (maximum 30 minutes) and 2 essays (5 pages each) or d) presentation (maximum 30 minutes) and take-home exam (time to complete: maximum 3 days, approx. 10 to 15 pages)* weighted 3:7. *A take-home exam is a set of questions -- its structure comparable to that of a written examination -- to be answered at home independently and in a relatively short period of time. Using aids is permitted but, just as is the case when writing papers, these aids must be thoroughly documented. Section 22 Subsection 11 ASPO (general academic and examination regulations) is in force. The exam will be completed electronically as specified by the examiner.
