Contents					
The seminar on project work either elaborates on and presents the topics from project work or examines a topic especially relevant to Clinical Psychology. The students prepare for every session by reading corresponding literature which is subsequently discussed and examined in the group.					
Intended learning outcomes					
Provided that the students participate on a regular basis, the seminar offers an opportunity to thoroughly study the contents of the project work or to acquire detailed knowledge of a specific clinical topic of Intervention Psy- chology. This also includes the critical examination of scientific publications. The students learn to apply diffe- rent techniques of reviewing and teaching individual topics. They won't be able to acquire these competencies if they only attend the seminar on the day of their own presentation.

A case report describes a disorder using the exam- ple of a (fictitious) patient; it includes a symptom report, a medical history, a behavioural assessment, a diagno- sis and a treatment plan derived from this. Allocation of places					
max. 12 places. Should the number of applications exceed the number of available places, places will be alloca- ted as follows: Applicants who have not yet achieved any of the required ECTS credits in the respective sub-area of mandatory electives will be given preferential consideration. The remaining places, if and when any become available, will be allocated to applicants who already have achieved ECTS credits. Within these groups, places will be allocated according to the number of subject semesters. Among applicants with the same number of sub- ject semesters, places will be allocated by lot.
