Contents					
The specialization in clinical diagnostics offers practical examples of topics and methods of clinical diagnostics based on case studies. The students learn to decide which diagnostic methods are to be used according to the situation and the individual case. They carry out these procedures in individual cases, evaluate the results and interpret the results.					
Intended learning outcomes					
Students acquire in-depth knowledge of various more complex diagnostic methods and procedures, as well as, on the basis of current test-theoretical models, the ability to develop, select, perform, present and interpret them. They will learn how to use diagnostic procedures to identify risk profiles, suicidal tendencies, signs of child welfare as well as signs of violent physical, psychological, sexual experiences and unfavorable treatment courses. They can systematically collect and assess progress and change processes. Finally, the students learn to recognize where the limits of their own diagnostic competence and judgment lie and learn to initiate measures for their own support and to recognize their necessity.
