<b>Contents</b>		
<p>In the seminar, the students acquire knowledge of the characteristics, application possibilities and production techniques of multimedia components. They become acquainted with the principles of working with boards. This knowledge enables them to take advantage of the possibilities and opportunities of working with interactive board systems. As an example of multimedia use in modern learning environments, the students practise working with interactive whiteboards, which are a digital version of the conventional blackboard. They study functions such as video and audio recording as well as computerised and self-directed learning processes.</p>		
<b>Intended learning outcomes</b>		
<p>The students have advanced knowledge of the handling of various electronic board systems. They have the requisite know-how needed to create pupil-centred learning environments and to integrate interactivity into teaching, for example for future teaching jobs.</p>
