Contents		
Christianity - its origins and its development through the ages. Knowledge of key texts of the New Testament, their connection, meaning in a historical context, and introduction to the exegetical methods. Exploring a selected topos or an epoch in the history of Christianity, the course consolidates the students' competence in the area of church history. The main focus is on Reformation and modernity as the central pillars from which sources focused on the history of the church will be read.		
Intended learning outcomes		
At the end of the course, students will be familiar with essential concepts of New Testament theology. They will be able to understand and interpret the content of key texts and to interrelate them with other texts. They will have developed the ability to situate issues within a historical context in a problem-orientated manner. In addition, they will have developed the ability to verbally express this knowledge in an appropriate manner. Students will also have developed an awareness of the historical development of Christianity as well as the changes and transformations it has undergone on the basis of present-day realities.
