In the study of art history major with 45 ECTS students acquire competence in terms of art historical analysis, scientific and cultural history and a deeper insight into the discourse of contemporary art history -related issues.

Through practical studies in sources in art-historical context, students acquire the ability to work in thematically and temporally limited extent independently methodically and scientifically an art historical issue.
