The consecutive Master Program Political and Social Sciences is projected for students with knowledge in Political Science and Sociology. The program is research orientated; it fosters skills for active and responsible scientific work.

The 45-Master program offers abundant possibilities for individual specialization. The program encompasses issues from Comparative Political Science, International Relations, Political Theory, quantitative and qualitative Research Methods, and Sociology. The profile is sharpened through thematic focusing in social research, work-related internships, international student exchange, and through additional qualifications.
