Das Studienfach Classics wird von der Philosophischen Fakultät der JMU als grundlagenorientierter Studiengang mit dem Abschluss „Bachelor of Arts“ (B.A.) (Erwerb von 180 ECTS-Punkten) im Rahmen eines konsekutiven Bachelor- und Master-Studienmodells angeboten.

Der interdisziplinäre Studiengang „Classics“ integriert die Disziplinen der Klassischen Archäologie, Alten Geschichte, Gräzistik und Latinistik und eröffnet ein breites Verständnis für die Archäologie, Literatur und Philologie insbesondere der griechischen und römischen Kultur. Ziel des Studiums ist es, die Studierenden über die kritische Auseinandersetzung mit materiellen, historischen und philologischen Quellen an ein vertieftes Verständnis für kulturhistorische Fragestellungen heranzuführen. Dabei sollen sie mit den jeweils fachspezifischen unterschiedlichen theoretischen und methodischen Zugängen vertraut werden und lernen, die Vielfalt disziplinärer Ansätze zu verstehen, einzuordnen und anzuwenden.
