## Contents

In project work, the students work in a group to carry out a study in the field of behaviour regulation with reference to health-psychological or clinical topics. First, they become familiar with theoretical principles and develop an experimental design in seminars and tutorials. Next, they are introduced to independent work and become acquainted with data collection, evaluation and interpretation under the guidance of a supervisor. After discussing the results, the students write individual reports in the form of manuscripts following the guidelines of the DGPs (German Society for Psychology) /APA (American Psychological Association). In the following seminar, which builds upon the project work, the students give oral presentations discussing fundamental works relevant to the project as well as the results of the project work.

## **Intended learning outcomes**

The students acquire profound theoretical knowledge as well as comprehensive methodological competencies in a specific research area of behaviour analysis and behaviour regulation. They advance their skills regarding the independent development of research ideas as well as the transferring into an empirical examination and the practical implementation of these ideas. 

The following topics will be discussed: introduction to neurons and glial cells, ion channels and membrane potential, channelopathies, synapses, transmitter release, NMJ, myasthenia gravis, cerebellum, basal ganglia, ataxia and Morbus Parkinson, somatosensory system, touch, pain, schizophrenia and autism spectrum disorders, cognitive disorders, muscle and muscular diseases, anatomy and function of the motor system, spinal reflexes, motor neurone diseases, hippocampus, learning and memory, anterograde amnesia, visual agnosia, cortex and limbic system, emotions, disorders of conscious and unconscious mental processes, attentiveness disorders, smell, taste and hearing, sleep, EEG, epilepsy, vision and disorders of the visual system. The literature seminars are based on fundamental literature on topics relevant to the lecture and serve to document the experiments underlying our present knowledge of neurobiology.

After successfully completing this module, the students will have gained insights into current theoretical concepts of neurobiology. The students examine clinical aspects of neurobiology with a focus on molecular, cellular and physiological mechanisms.
