

Content and Objectives of the Programme

The interdisciplinary degree programme Mittelalter und Frühe Neuzeit (Medieval and Early Modern Studies, 120 ECTS) offers research-oriented specialist training. Graduates will be well equipped for both academic and highly skilled non-academic careers, e. g. in culture or cultural management. Offering a broad and diverse range of courses from various disciplines, this programme equips students with specialist knowledge on research topics in medieval and early modern studies, with historical research skills and with proficiency in cutting-edge methods in the humanities. Students who graduated from this programme will

- be able to discuss issues in an appropriate manner, both in oral and written form, and to present these in a suitable manner to a target audience,
- be able to discuss, in scholarly detail and in an appropriate manner, research findings as well
 as specialised problems of the discipline,
- have enhanced the discursive skills they developed e. g. by actively participating in courses,
- be able to independently identify research problems and desiderata and develop solutions, using scholarly methods,
- have gained the research experience necessary for transfer to a doctoral programme.







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This module focuses on consolidating students' knowledge of historical auxiliary sciences and giving students an opportunity to independently apply this knowledge, employ the methods of the disciplines, and use relevant forms of presentation. Discussing selected examples, the module consolidates students' previous knowledge of historical auxiliary sciences. Problems in historical auxiliary sciences are explored in both source-based and research-oriented courses. Problems in cultural, social, structural, and economic history, the history of society, and the history of mentalities as well as interdisciplinary problems are also considered.

Intended learning outcomes

Students are able to familiarise themselves with more complex issues, employing the methods of the discipline and taking into account relevant source material and secondary literature as well as the findings of related disciplines. They are able to independently analyse and interpret sources and accounts of medieval history.
