Content and Objectives of the Programme

The Master's degree programme Cultural Landscapes (120 ECTS credits) offers research-oriented specialist training. Graduates will be well equipped for both academic and highly skilled non-academic careers in the area of history education. Graduates of the degree programme Cultural Landscapes will • have gained detailed insights into selected topics in local and regional history taking a comparative transatlantic perspective. In this context, graduates will also have explored aspects of both American and European history. • be able to reflect on research findings in the field of history, to independently identify research problems and desiderata and to develop solutions, drawing on a sound knowledge of the scientific discipline, using historical methods. • be able to incorporate the knowledge of the impact history and culture have on regions into history education as well as into practical tasks in the area of culture and regional development. • have gained the research experience necessary for a possible transfer to a doctoral programme after the award of the Master's degree.
