Wissenschaftliche Befähigung

- Die Absolvent/innen haben ein umfassendes und exemplarisch vertieftes Wissen über die Fakten zur Geistes# und Kulturgeschichte sowie Sprachen und Literaturen des indischen Subkontinents von der Antike über die klassische Zeit bis zur Gegenwart. Außerdem besitzen sie exemplarisch vertiefte Kenntnisse über eine bestimmte Region bzw. regionale Traditionen des indischen Subkontinents. Sie haben weiterhin ihre Kenntnisse der wichtigsten Epochen der Geistes#, Kultur# und Literaturgeschichte sowie der politischen Geschichte bis zur Gegenwart forschungsorientiert vertieft.
- Die Absolvent/innen haben ihre Kenntnisse aktueller wie historischer südasienspezifischer sozial# und religionsgeschichtlicher Theorien forschungsorientiert vertieft. Sie haben das Problembewusstsein für die Spezifika der indischen Literaturen (auch oraler Literaturen), kulturellen Traditionen und der darin wurzelnden Gesellschaft geschärft, vertieft und geübt.
- Die Absolvent/innen haben ihre Lese#, Übersetzungs# und Sprachkompetenz in der modernen indischen Sprache Hindi und deren Schriftsystem oder – je nach Spezialisierung – ihre Lese# und Übersetzungskompetenz in der klassischen indischen Sprache Sanskrit und deren Schriftsystem vertieft. Weiterhin haben die Absolvent/innen ihre Kenntnisse der zweiten indischen Sprache Sanskrit bzw. je nach Spezialisierung der indischen Sprache Hindi (nach Wahl auch einer dritten indischen Sprache wie Kannada oder einer mittelindischen Sprache) vertieft.
- Die Absolvent/innen haben je nach Spezialisierung ihre Kenntnisse der südasienethnologischen Feldforschungsmethoden vertieft und projektorientiert geübt.
- Die Absolvent/innen haben ihre Kenntnisse über die wichtigsten Forschungsparadigmen in der zeitgenössischen internationalen Indologie forschungsorientiert vertieft und geschärft. Weiterhin haben sie das Problembewusstsein für indologische Problemstellungen, Untersuchungsmethoden und Theorieansätze geschärft, vertieft und geübt.
- Die Absolvent/innen haben ihre Fertigkeit zur Einhaltung wissenschaftlicher Arbeitstechniken vertieft und können indologische/südasienkundliche bzw. südasienbezogene Sachverhalte ohne Mühe sprachlich angemessen in Wort und Schrift darstellen. Sie sind geübt in der strukturierten Aufbereitung von wissenschaftlicher Literatur sowie in der Abfassung verschiedener wissenschaftlicher Texttypen. Zudem sind die Absolvent/innen gewandt in der selbstständigen Entfaltung und sprachlich angemessenen Darstellung indologischer/südasienkundlicher bzw. südasienbezogener Sachverhalte.

Befähigung, eine qualifizierte Erwerbstätigkeit aufzunehmen

- Die Absolvent/innen haben die Fähigkeit forschungsorientiert ausgebaut, Texte in ihrer Konstruiertheit zu reflektieren und in historischen bzw. gesellschaftlichen Zusammenhängen zu problematisieren bzw. ihren Quellenstatus angemessen zu reflektieren. Weiterhin haben sie die Fähigkeit forschungsorientiert erweitert, Problemzusammenhänge in mündlicher wie schriftlicher Form sachgerecht aufzubereiten und – unter angemessenem Medieneinsatz – zielgruppenspezifisch zu vermitteln.
- Die Absolvent/innen sind darin geübt, Lehreinheiten selbständig zu gestalten, Diskussionen zu leiten und ihren Standpunkt klar zu vertreten.
- Die Absolvent/innen haben durch die intensive Auseinandersetzung mit der indischen Kultur die Fähigkeit vertieft, sich in fremde Kulturen einzufinden. Die von ihnen erworbene interkulturelle Kompetenz können sie in unterschiedlichen interkulturellen Kontexten anwenden.

Die Absolvent/innen haben ihre Fähigkeit gesellschaftliche und kulturelle Entwicklungen kritisch zu reflektieren und deren Auswirkungen auf die Gesellschaft und Umwelt zu erfassen, sy-



stematisch vertieft und ausgebaut. Sie haben die Fähigkeit vertieft, Themen und Problemfelder in übergeordnete historische, soziale und politische Zusammenhänge einzuordnen und vor diesem Hintergrund begründet Position zu beziehen. Sie sind verstärkt in der Lage, sich in einer zunehmend komplexer werdenden Welt zu orientieren und eine Wertvorstellung für das eigene Denken und Handeln zu entwickeln.
