Focus will be on biodiversity and ecosystem functions, multi-trophic interactions and food nets, evolutionary ecology, chemical ecology, tropical ecology, agricultural ecology, and global change. In the seminar, recent scientific publications within the topics mentioned above will be presented and discussed.

A selection of methods relevant for planning in conservation contexts such as monitoring tools, landscape mapping, natural capital valuation and others will be introduced. The students select a conservation-relevant topic, identify different perspectives or conflicts of interest in the context of sustainability, select and apply the appropriate tools. The students analyse the data, present the results and discuss them among their peers.
