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## **Content and Objectives of the Programme**

The student of French Studies learns scientifically relevant and analytical/methodical basic skills in the most important philological areas. Besides well-founded knowledge of the language and a competence in use of French approaching that of native speakers, the student acquires a profound, structured and adaptable knowledge in the subdisciplines of French linguistics, literature and cultural and regional studies. On this basis, the student is equipped to recognize fundamental and current philological questions and to apply scientific methods to them. An important place in studies is given to the development of the ability to analyse texts of all kinds from literary, cultural and linguistic perspectives. The aim of these studies is to equip students to deal with professional and academic challenges in all the various linguistic, textual and cultural contexts.

They will acquire central techniques of the academic work (information research as well as preparation and presentation of information) concerning the Romance linguistics.

Application of concepts and methods from the selected sub-areas of the French language. Coherences between the French and further Romance Languages.

#### **Intended learning outcomes**

Students acquire detailed knowledge of a central sub-area of linguistics. They are able to apply concepts and methods of this sub-area to the description of the French and are able to balance between different linguistic descriptions of a given verbal phenomenon. They are also able to summarise analogously, to classify academically and historically and to critically reflect selected academic literature regarding French linguistics independently. Students are able to work on a defined issue, to present it and produce a short academic paper.
