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Content and Objectives of the Programme

The programme in this course of study aims at inducting the student into the main fields of Pre- and Protohistoric Archaeology and is designed for imparting the methodology of archaeological work and overviewing the cultural groups in Europe during pre- and protohistoric times.

The examinations in the individual modules of the subsidiary course of study are designed for asserting that the candidate is acquainted with the main subject matters of the courses attended and that he/she is capable of preparing oral and written papers on specified topics of Pre- and Protohistoric Archaeology in applying learnt scientific methods.
