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Content and Objectives of the Programme

The Minor in Private Law is offered as a supplementary course of study to BA students studying a major subject other than Law. The Bachelor's Degree is conferred in the student's major course of study.

Students enrolled in this minor do so within the framework of the existing general courses offered by the Law Department. They acquire a good grounding in the German Civil Code as well as in the areas of Commercial Law, Employment Law and Companies Law. Additionally, students are given the opportunity to study at an advanced level by the offering of elective courses in Collective Employment Law, European and International Private and Economic Law as well as History and Philosophy of Law.

This Minor provides students with an understanding both of the methodology and substantive knowledge in the area of Private Law. As a useful addition to their major course of study, students acquire legal competencies in the areas they have chosen, raising their employability in a wide range of areas. The study of this minor enables students to recognise legal problems, and, if required in their chosen professions, contribute to finding appropriate legal solutions in cooperation with fully qualified lawyers.
