

### Wissenschaftliche Befähigung

- Die Absolvent\*innen können fachliche Problemzusammenhänge in mündlicher wie schriftlicher Form sachgerecht aufbereiten sowie nach musealen und medialen Erfordernissen zielgruppenspezifisch kommunizieren. Sie haben eine theoretisch reflektierte wie praxisorientierte Kompetenz erlangt, naturwissenschaftliche, künstlerische und kulturelle Objekte zu sammeln, zu bewahren, zu erforschen, zu interpretieren und auszustellen, d.h. diese mit verschiedenen Mitteln und unter Berücksichtigung materialkundlicher Kenntnisse sowie pädagogischer Erfordernisse an unterschiedliche Öffentlichkeiten zu vermitteln.

### Befähigung zur Aufnahme einer qualifizierten Erwerbstätigkeit

- Die Absolvent\*innen haben als Generalist\*innen in den traditionellen Feldern der Museumsarbeit (Sammeln, Bewahren, Erforschen, Vermitteln, Ausstellen), aber auch in den Bereichen Materielle und Immaterielle Kultur, Kulturmarketing und Museumsmanagement qualifizierte berufspraktische Kompetenzen für die Arbeit im Museums- und Ausstellungswesen erworben und können diese kritisch hinterfragen. Sie verfügen zudem über generelle Kompetenzen für die Vermittlung, die Präsentation, das Management und die Kommunikation kultureller Dienstleistungen im weiten Feld der Kulturarbeit und Kulturpolitik, z.B. in der Bildungsarbeit, im Mediensektor oder in der Freizeit- und Tourismusindustrie.
- Durch die kontinuierliche Zusammenarbeit der Würzburger Museologie mit Museen und anderen Kultureinrichtungen können sich die Studierenden mit potenziellen Arbeitgebern im Ausstellungs-, Museums- und Kultursektor vernetzen.
- Die Absolvent\*innen sind in der Lage, konstruktiv und zielorientiert in heterogenen Teams (Arbeitsgruppen) zusammenzuarbeiten, unterschiedliche Ansichten produktiv zur Zielerreichung zu nutzen und mögliche Konflikte zu bearbeiten. Sie können eine Aufgabe nicht nur aus fachlicher Sicht, sondern auch unter Einbezug der finanziellen und personellen Ressourcen des Praxispartners sowie unter Einbezug der Erwartungen und Bedürfnisse der Zielgruppen unter Zeitund Erfolgsdruck umsetzen. Dabei setzen sich die Studierenden auch mit organisatorischen und gesellschaftlichen Aspekten auseinander.
- Die Absolvent\*innen haben Einblicke in internationale Entwicklungen im Museums- und Ausstellungswesen. Im Rahmen eines Praktikums im Ausland oder eines fakultativen Auslandssemesters wurden weitere fachliche und berufsqualifizierende Kompetenzen erworben da Museen ein weltweites Phänomen sind, verbessert ein Auslandsstudium ihre Berufschancen und weitet ihren museologischen Blick.



### Befähigung zum gesellschaftlichen Engagement

• Die Projektlehre (s.o.) der Würzburger Museologie folgt dem Service Learning-Gedanken. Die Studierenden besuchen dabei regelmäßig Lehrveranstaltungen ("Learning") und leisten in deren Rahmen einen gemeinnützigen Dienst ("Service"), indem sie hier ein konkretes Ergebnis erarbeiten, das den involvierten Praxispartnern zur Verfügung gestellt wird. Dieser Service wird so ausgewählt, dass praktische Aspekte des theoretischen Seminarinhalts aufgegriffen werden, um theoretische wie berufspraktische Kompetenzen zu vermitteln. Die Lernenden übernehmen dadurch gesellschaftliche und ethische Verantwortung für Andere und verarbeiten anschaulicher und besser die fachlichen Inhalte. Dabei fördert Service Learning sowohl den Praxisbezug der universitären Lehre als auch die Partizipation von Studierenden an der demokratischen Gestaltung des öffentlichen Lebens: Die Studierenden arbeiten in Teilprojekten, die erst im Zusammenwirken das öffentlich präsentierte Gesamtergebnis ausmachen.

### Persönlichkeitsentwicklung

- Die Absolvent\*innen verfügen über diskursive Fähigkeiten, über Team-, Kontakt- und Kritikfähigkeit, sie können selbstständig, eigenverantwortlich sowie zielorientiert arbeiten und dabei ihr fachliches Wissen anwenden.

### **Contents**

The Botanical Garden of the University of Würzburg is primarily used for teaching and research-related activities.
