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Content and Objectives of the Programme

The Bachelor degree »English and American Studies« deals with the language and literature of the English-speaking world. It conveys expertise in the fields of English language and grammar, English and American literature, English and American culture, and English linguistics. In the course of their studies, students will receive specialized academic training in Anglophone Studies, deepen their English-language proficiency and enhance their analytical skills. This program of study is designed to prepare students for a wide range of employment opportunities upon completion of the degree. As a first job-qualifying degree, the Bachelor »English and American Studies« responds to the demands of today's working environment as many professional fields require a sophisticated knowledge and understanding of languages as well as highly developed cultural and academic competences. Contents
