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## Content and Objectives of the Programme

In the Bachelor programme Russian Language and Culture as main subject (120 ECTS), the student gains familiarity with the most important subdisciplines of Russian Studies: literature, linguistics, cultural studies and regional studies as well as with methods in Russian Studies and acquisition of language skills. The student is also equipped to adapt flexibly to tasks arising in all the various professional fields open to graduates of the BA programme. Primary professional fields are in education and cultural pedagogics in the broadest sense, but also in tourism, media, publishing and industry. In addition, these studies provide the basic knowledge for admission to Master of Arts programme (MA) in Russian Language and Culture and other thematically related MA programmes.
