## Content and Objectives of the Programme

The emphasis in the Bachelor programme Russian Language and Culture as secondary subject (60 ECTS) lies on acquiring knowledge of the history and culture of Russia and of economic and political developments in Russia and the GUS States.

The student is also equipped to adapt flexibly to tasks arising in all the various professional fields open to graduates of the BA programme.

Primary professional fields are in education and cultural pedagogics in the broadest sense, but also in tourism, media, publishing and industry.
