Wissenschaftliche Befähigung:

- Die Absolventinnen und Absolventen verfügen über historisches Grundwissen aus allen historischen Epochen sowie zusätzliche Kenntnisse spezieller Themen aus der Geschichte der Antike und des Mittelalters sowie der mittelalterlichen Landesgeschichte.

Sie sind in der Lage, über hilfswissenschaftliche Inhalte und Probleme sowohl mit Fachkolleginnen und kollegen als auch mit einer breiteren, historisch interessierten Öffentlichkeit zu kommunizieren.

- Ein typisches Berufsfeld für Historikerinnen und Historiker existiert nicht. Dennoch erwerben die Studierenden in ihrem Geschichtsstudium grundlegende Kompetenzen zur Bewältigung sich wandelnder und zunehmend differenzierter Herausforderungen im Berufsleben.
- Die Absolventinnen und Absolventen sind in der Lage, die von ihnen im Laufe des Studiums erworbenen wissenschaftlichen Methoden auf ihnen unbekannte fachliche Probleme und nicht vertraute Praxisfelder erfolgreich anzuwenden.
