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Content and Objectives of the Programme

The student of French Studies learns scientifically relevant and analytical/methodical basic skills in the most important philological areas. Besides well-founded knowledge of the language and a competence in use of French approaching that of native speakers, the student acquires a profound, structured and adaptable knowledge in the subdisciplines of Italian linguistics, literature, and cultural and regional studies. On this basis, the student is equipped to recognize fundamental and current philological questions and to apply scientific methods to them. An important place in studies is given to the development of the ability to analyze texts of all kinds from literary, cultural and linguistic perspectives. The aim of these studies is to equip students to deal with professional and academic challenges in all the various linguistic, textual and cultural contexts.

Central issues and methods of historical linguistics as well as important structural elements of the French language and Romance Languages in general will be covered, too. Students will learn about the most important linguistic theories. They will acquire central techniques of the academic work (information research as well as preparation and presentation of information) concerning the Romance linguistics.

Students acquire basic skills of French and Romance linguistics. They are able to apply the most important linguistic description terms and methods to the French language. Students are familiar with basic techniques of scientific work in the area of Romance linguistics.




